Members range in age from 35 to 94 years. The majority are retired and able to be actively involved, with the experienced members mentoring those who are newer or working, helping them to get involved however possible. In addition to financial donations, members volunteer hundreds of hours working on vital projects that impact our local, national, and global communities. Our members are motivated, compassionate, creative, civic minded, infinitely generous, and grateful to give back to others.

Orchestrated with the active involvement of three dedicated WCC members, the event embodies the spirit of charity and philanthropy, introducing the WCC to new attendees and inspiring community engagement. The Woman's Club of Cypress (WCC) extends its commitment to inclusivity and community well-being through the Edgemont Circle Holiday Party. Ensuring everyone can partake without financial constraints, the WCC offers free amenities, including food, drinks, popcorn, hot chocolate, candy tables, face painting, and live music. This year, which has witnessed the collective loss of lives, including both members and their loved ones, calls for a special tribute. In a heartfelt departure from traditional gestures, the WCC has chosen to redirect funds typically allocated for flowers towards philanthropy, contributing to causes chosen in honor of the departed member. This thoughtful initiative aims to perpetuate their lifelong commitment to giving back, and we are proud to share that these efforts have raised a commendable \$4,129. In addition to this impactful contribution, the WCC remains actively engaged in other meaningful projects, embodying the spirit of compassion and community support.

Project Title: _ _ President's Projects _ _ Hours 80 Donated \$150 _ _ In Kind \$700

As an integral part of the President's Project, our club actively participated in a fundraising initiative benefiting Orange County's Second Harvest Food Bank, culminating in a walk at Tanaka Farms on September 9th,

2023. This collective effort aimed to address food insecurity in our local communities, establishing a positive and enduring relationship with Second Harvest. Through online contributions, our club members successfully raised \$1,350 for Second Harvest, earning recognition at the event as one of the top fundraisers. On the event day, several club members came together to complete the walk, creating a joyful and celebratory atmosphere in acknowledgment of the successful fundraiser. Looking ahead, we are enthusiastic about sustaining our support for Second Harvest Food Bank in the ongoing future. Continuing the past President's mission of inclusion, we also contributed to the Cypress Champion Baseball. This is a program dedicated to providing the opportunity for individuals with special needs, aged 4 to 40, to engage in the beloved American game of baseball at no cost. With a current enrollment of 185 players, the program warmly welcomes donations to support its endeavors. In the past year, we contributed new equipment to enhance the players' experience. For the spring season, our donation included 10 baseball bats, 5 helmets, and 3 equipment bags, with a total value of \$806. In the summer, we furthered our support by donating 72 gloves and 8 bases, totaling \$1,500. Through a strategic partnership with a local business, Play It Again Sports, we secured a 30% discount on the new equipment. Funding for these contributions was sourced from a \$500 allocation from the philanthropy budget, with the remaining \$1,806 raised through donations at general meetings and a successful BUNCO fundraiser. This project holds immense significance for our club as it not only benefits players from Cypress but also extends support to members from the surrounding community. Notably, it stands as the largest Pony Champions program in the nation. Witnessing the joy on the players' faces and receiving heartfelt expressions of gratitude from parents and caregivers makes this project profoundly rewarding for our club.

Project Title: __Cypress Women's Conference ___ Hours 327 Donated \$100 In Kind \$100

The Cypress Women's Conference stands as a pinnacle of inspiration and empowerment, providing a platform for influential speakers to share their insights and experiences. Notable figures like Claudia Bonilla Keller, CEO of Second Harvest Food Bank Orange County, and Angie Kardashian, an accomplished entrepreneur, graced the conference with their impactful presentations. Additionally, a career panel featuring Dr. Nancy Nien, Assistant Superintendent of Business for the Anaheim Union High School District; Natalie Nacker, Fire Captain/Paramedic with the Orange County Fire Authority; and Dr. Diana Lee, Ophthalmologist and Founder of The Women Doctors, offered valuable perspectives on diverse professional journeys. The profound impact these women have made in their respective fields and communities resonates directly with our own community. In a special recognition, our very own Women's Club of Cypress Recording Secretary, local business owner and resident, Shirley Bradley, was honored as the Cypress Woman of the Year—an acknowledgment by the public that reflects the significant contributions of women within our organization to the broader community. The Cypress Women's Conference continues to be a catalyst for positive change and celebrates the remarkable achievements of women who shape and inspire our community. The Women's Conference successfully raised an impressive \$1274.00.
