

#### Hi and welcome to Fall!

I thought you might be interested in what's been going on in this busy month of September.

I just got back from the two-day California Federation of Woman's Clubs Fall Board Meeting, held in Costa Mesa. It was packed with new ideas and information from CF Program Chairs and Executive Committee members.

We heard from two great speakers. The first was Jana Hoffman, assistant DA for Orange County. Her main focus is child abuse and violence against women. She reminded us about how much organizations like BACA (Bikers Against Child Abuse) and CASA (Court Appointed Special Advocates) do to protect and advocate for abused children.

Our second speaker was Kelly Carroll, Associate Director of Development for the American Cancer Society. She told us about Gold Together which is the American Cancer Society's childhood cancer initiative group that raises funds to directly support research, education, advocacy, and services that build communities of support for young cancer patients.

Marcia Willett launched her new Just One Campaign Just One is a domestic violence prevention campaign that seeks to place signs in public restrooms informing DV victims of a way to receive help. The signs provide the 1-800 number for the National Domestic Violence Hotline available 24/7 with trained personnel assisting the caller to find resources in their area. Our goal is to place one sign for each of the 9,045 CFWC members. Hence the name, Just One: one member placing one sign to help one person. (cont. page 2)

CF Board Meetings are held three times a year. 



One way to do this is to write letters to your elected officials to urge action on particular resolutions adopted by the GFWC. #### Abusers Use Predictable Tactics for Control and Manipulation. Here's What to Look for and Learn How to Help Your Loved Ones.

**Gaslighting:** using denial, lying information, and contradiction to make their partner doubt their sanity, memory, and perception. These conversations are done in isolation from friends and family.

**Projection:** criticizing others for things they do themselves.

**Guilt-tripping:** Passive-aggressive way to remind someone of something bad they did to manipulate them to make up for it.

**Silent treatment:** ignoring messages, calls, or questions to make their partner feel uncertain, to create self-doubt in their perception.

Throwing tantrums: raising their voice, using lots of gestures, and sometimes abusing to get what they want to induce fear.

**Negative humor:** critical remarks disguised as sarcasm or humor to perpetuate insecurity and inferiority in the other person.

Pretend ignorance: playing dumb to get away with harmful behavior.

**Victimhood:** designed to exploit someone's goodwill, guilty conscience, and protective and nurturing instinct for the perpetrator's personal benefit.

**Constant criticism:** marginalizing, ridiculing, and dismissing how their abusive words make the victim feel.

Great news. Laura's House has a free 1.5-hour virtual workshop designed to give family members and friends tools to help a loved one they suspect is in an unhealthy relationship.

The workshop will cover warning signs, harmful behaviors, barriers to leaving, starting conversations, safety planning & codependency. So, mark your calendars!

Their Mission: to cover Service Members and Veterans touched by war with comforting and healing Quilts of Valor.

I know one of the members who make these beautiful Quilts and I have added a couple of pictures of them for you to see. Each Quilt is made especially for the Veteran it is being presented to. Since November 11th is Veterans Day it would be such a wonderful project to look into for any of the Veteran Women in your Club.









The Quilts of Valor Foundation is a national organization founded in 2003 by "Blue Star" mom Catherine Roberts. With a son deployed in Iraq – a gunner sitting atop a Humvee – she felt ten seconds away from panic 24 hours a day, every day. It was during that time her son was deployed that she had the idea of comforting Veterans with quilts.




